Competitors should arrive and sign up for a relay 20 mins prior to the relay they wish to shoot on.

Black Powder

January, the Full Wolf Moon due to the wolves howling in hunger outside their villages. As I shared with you last month, except when necessary to feed themselves and family, the hunter/trapper has taken shelter from the weather for the winter.

There are many tasks that can be done indoors that need to be completed. Repairs of all equipment, especially the traps, must be made so all is ready when the season begins. New clothing, possibles bags, accoutrements, and moccasins needed to be made. Rifles tended to be repaired immediately, when possible, as they were necessary every day. It was also a time for reading, by those who could, and talking. Those conversations passed the knowledge of the old timers to the greenhorns (those new to the mountains).

The buckskinners of WWCCA are no different. We continue to meet on Thursday nights at the blacksmith shop to make or build the necessities of our sport and to talk. We often discuss whatever we are reading and learning and share our knowledge with those who want to learn.

On occasion we discuss what it was that first drew us to the sport. Often mentioned are movies like "Jeremiah Johnson". Television shows like Disney's Davy Crockett series or Daniel Boone, both starring Fess Parker. Others mention books like "Give Your Heart to the Hawks – A Tribute to the Mountain Men" by Win Blevins or "Carry The Wind" which begins the series of books sharing the saga of Titus Bass and Josiah Paddock and their adventures in the mountains. Still others remember their military days of service and coming home with a passion for the shooting sports in all of its forms to discover black powder rifles. Still others began with their passion for history and found they could combine that with shooting by using black powder firearms. Greenhorns tend to reference movies like "The Patriot" and "Last of the Mohicans".

The ways we came to the sport are as different as the people shooting it. Our single commonality is our sport.

One memory that drew me to the sport was reading "Centennial" by James A Michener published in 1974. I remember reading about the beaver trappers Pasquinel and Alexander McKeag. It is the later who describes "Lapsang souchong" as "a man's tea, deep and subtle and blended in some rugged place". McKeag proclaims the tea to be "better even than whisky". I will admit that the teas flavors of smoke, earth and a hint of leather remind me of some of my favorite scotches. I also admit that it is pleasant to sip the tea at home on those occasions I am not out camping longhunter style. But better than whisky? Not in this man's eyes. Probably something to do with the fact the tea is made by exposing the leaves to the smoke of burning pinewood and scotch is made by drying the barley with smoke from burning peat. Both will take you to the out of doors even while you sit before a roaring fire fighting off the cold.

Speaking of camping January is the month of "The Wintering". Held the last full weekend of January (the 25th to the 27th this year) the men and women of Tonquish Creek Muzzleloaders will be camping primitive style in the primitive area. If sleeping in canvas tents in January is too intimidating we have bunks in the blockhouse and blacksmith shop each with a wood burning stove. Or you could just drop by for a visit. If no one is outside try the second floor of the blockhouse which is where we usually gather. A shooting contest will take place "about" noon on Saturday with a dinner to follow. If you have questions or plan to attend please contact Greg Baack for details, you will find his number in The Window.

Our regular monthly meeting will be held on January 10 about 7:30 at the blacksmith shop.

Why not avoid some of that potential cabin fever and come out to join us for one of these events.

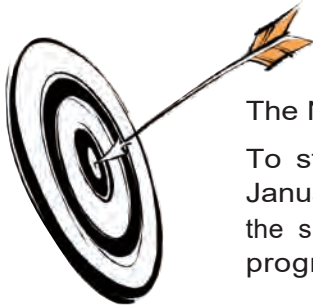

Archery News

The New Year is here! Let's kick it off by seeing what archery has to offer.

To start we have our Junior archery program. The 1st 12 week program starts on January 8th at 6pm in the club house. The second Junior program starts on June 4th at 6pm on the shotgun range. Both of these programs require early registration. The June program also offers adult lessons.

Most of our shoots and leagues are for all ages except for our winter indoor league, You must be 18 or older. This league shoots on Thursdays at 6pm starting January 3rd for 12 weeks.

Now for outdoor archery. We have 2 leagues that shoot once a month for 5 months. Summer league starts on May 19th from 9am to 2pm. The winter league starts on November 3rd at 9am to 2pm. We also have 3D shoots every month from January to September and our Toys for Tots 3D shoot in December. Something new is our Thursday night 3D shoots on the stand up range all 4 Thursdays in September. Our stand up range also offers hunters tune up every Thursday night in June, July and August. Lastly on Friday night October 4th we will have our 4th annual ZOMBIE SHOOT !
