We had 20 people compete during the last match.

The dates for the rest of the winter league are below:

March 3rd – 10am to 1pm

April 7th – 10am to 1pm

Again, this year we are shooting a 3-round match. Here is the course of fire:

5 sighting in shots (5 minutes)

10 shots: prone slow fire (10 minutes)

10 shots: sitting/kneeling slow fire (10 minutes)

10 shots: standing slow fire (10 minutes)

Relays will be at 10:00 am, 11:00 pm and 12:00 pm. Competitors should arrive and sign up for a relay 20 mins prior to the relay they wish to shoot on. Any rifle, any sights are welcome to this match, and your scores are grouped based on your rifle setup.

If you want to come for a match but need some guidance on format or just a little extra time for setup I suggest coming for the noon session and we will be able to assist you in getting familiar with the competition format.

So, come on out and work on your position rifle shooting! Remember, even though you may have missed a date you can make it up by shooting multiple times in a single day.

Black Powder

Grab a cup of coffee or your favorite beverage and set down a bit to learn what is going on with the black powder shooters.

I will grant you that the members of the Tonquish Creek Muzzleloaders shoot the walk thru more than most folks but just thought I would let you know that the top five shooting scores for the Walk Thru held during the Wintering were members of WWCCA. Well done lads!. (No women were shooting that day.)

Now it is true that the temperatures strongly argued for those in attendance to spend most of their time indoors. Different folks were in charge of different meals with my favorite being the rabbit stew prepared by Hugh. When we were not dining we enjoyed other pastimes like some song singing (sans instruments as the cold was just too cold for them), certainly some consumption of adult beverages (which was a contributor to our singing I suppose), a whole lot of time jawing/storytelling, and laughing until our sides hurt.

But we were productive as well. Folks spent some time in the blacksmith shop (another warm location) making knives and working on other needs they had. A good time was had by everyone that attended. At least that is what I witnessed.

The month of March will be filled with the typical monthly events: blackpowder walk thru at 10 am on March 3, the meeting at 7:30 pm on March 14 and the weekly gun building, project working get togethers at the blacksmith shop.

The big doings in March is our annual trip to Kalamazoo the weekend of March 16-17. Now I cannot verify that anyone has ever proven the theory by doing it but it is the belief of Leonard Darnell that a man or woman so inclined could walk into the Kalamazoo Living History Show stark naked with a wad of cash and walk out with absolutely everything they would need to participate in this sport of ours.

That would include your clothing, footwear, locks, stocks, barrels, knife, hawk, belts, possibles bag (and everything a person should have in them), patch, ball, bullet molds, hats, scarves, beads, quills, and all the foofaraw a man or woman would need to portray the person/period they have chosen from as late as the 1840's to as early as the 1750's. And that is just the person themselves. If you wanted to camp you could find the tents, the cooking irons, cast iron cook wear, tin cups, and the candles you might want to use at night. Literally everything. If you do not know what some of these words mean feel free to drop into one of our events and ask. We would be happy to explain or show you.

If you are not into recreating the period the show is still one of the best for just learning about our history from say the Native American to the Eastern Longhunters and Trappers to the French and Indian war to the Lewis and Clark expedition and ending with the Western Mountain Men. You would find that many of the vendors, and there are roughly 250 of the finest artisans you can find, would be happy to explain and answer any polite questions. They will also be selling books, papers, patterns, video, and training materials to explain and/ educate you about the times we recreate. And you can usually find something inexpensive that will delight your child or grandchild. All for \$7 a person. What a deal!

And education! Along with the vendors, most of whom delight in sharing their knowledge, the show has regular speaker programs to teach. The 2019 Kalamazoo Living History Show takes a look at historic agriculture, from Native food production methods and historic farm techniques to the modern "Farm to Table" movement.

We would like to encourage everyone interested in our Bowling Pin, Falling Plate, Steel Challenge events, to attend our meeting. New handgun shooters, we would like to meet you and introduce you to our group. This will be a great venue to ask questions or just listen if you are a bit bashful.
