Rifle News

The next (Match #3) Winter League rifle match will be held Saturday, February 4th on the 100 Yard range. Relays will begin every hour from 10:00 until 1:00 (10:00, 11:00, 12:00 and 1:00). If you wish to shoot more than one match on the same day, you are welcome to do so. Winter league is a 30 round "Slow Fire" match shot on the 100 yard range.

- 10 shots standing slow fire
- 10 shots sitting slow fire
- 10 shots prone slow fire

Any rifle, any sights are welcome to this match, and results will be separated into 3 groups:

- Service Rifle: As-issued AR-15
- Garand: As-issued Garand / Springfield / Vintage
- Target Class: Any centerfire scoped rifle

Guests are Welcome to the Winter League!

Guests (non-members) are welcome to participate, but must be accompanied by a WWCCA member. Cost of the match is \$5 for members, and \$15 for non-members.

New Shooter Orientation Relay is at 1:00 pm

If you haven't shot in a Rifle match before, we encourage you to come out – it is absolutely the best way to become a better rifle shooter. If you are new to position rifle shooting, please come to either the 12:00 or 1:00 pm relay because most the 10:00 and 11:00 relays are the busiest. At the 1:00 pm relay, new shooters take priority, and we will conduct a brief orientation and cover the basic fundamentals to shoot the match. You can get as much or as little coaching from an experienced shooter that you want. The Club has an AR-15 or Garand for use at no charge, but if you shoot a Club rifle, you must use Club ammo at extra charge. If you are a new shooter and have questions about the match, please don't hesitate to call or email me.

Garand Class and Match is in May

For comprehensive instruction in position Rifle shooting, the annual "Garand Class" will be held Tuesday and Thursday night 5/15 and 5/17, with a Garand match with dedicated individual instruction for each shooter during the entire match on Saturday 5/19. Last year we limited the class to 30 shooters, and registration was closed 3 weeks in advance, so **Register Early!!!** This is a CMP sanctioned class and match, taught by CMP Master instructors. The class is designed to introduce beginner shooters in standing, sitting and prone positions. Cost of the class is \$40. Please see the brochure for the class in this newsletter for details.

MI Garand Class & Match May 15th, 17th, 19st

WWCCA will host an MI Garand Class designed to introduce New Shooters to the fundamentals of position shooting with this classic firearm. The course is sanctioned by the CMP and will be instructed by Frank Sinagra, CMP Master Instructor, Mike Bailey, CMP Master Instructor, and Steve Miller, certified NRA Rifle Instructor. This course will cover the safe handling and operation of the M1 Garand, hands-on instruction of the Standing, Sitting and Prone positions, instruction on how to shoot a CMP Garand Match, and rifle accuracy techniques. Class instruction with dry-fire practice in each position will be Tuesday and Thursday night from 6:30 pm to 10:00 pm (5/15 and 5/17) in the WWCCA Clubhouse, followed by an actual live-fire CMP Garand 30-round Match shot on the Club's 100 yard range on Saturday May 19st from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm. During Saturday's match, Club Experts will coach each shooter safely and effectively through the course. You may bring your own Garand, or use one of the Club's Garands at no additional charge. By the conclusion of this course, beginner Shooters will have a clear understanding of position shooting and will be prepared to shoot a 3-position Garand match.

Cost is \$40 for this course, which includes CMP course materials, awards, and 35 rounds of 30'06 ammunition. Space is limited and you must **pre-register** for this course to participate. Email steve@vaultse.com to reserve your spot, and we will reply with a confirmation email unless the class is full (first come, first serve). Children 16-18 must be accompanied by parent; no one under 16.

Black Powder Trails

"A well regulated Militia, being necessary to the security of a free State, the right of the people to keep and bear Arms, shall not be infringed".

Greetings in this month the Chippewa's call "Moon of the crusted snow". While we sit here in the sun outside my lodge, watching the fresh elk tenderloin roast cooking over the fire, let's go over the schedule.

I do not have the calendar for this year yet so we'll wing it until I get one. It's early New Years Eve as I write this article and I don't want to bother Greg at the moment to ask him what's going on. I would, however, urge you to call Greg before committing to anything specific other than the meeting, just to be on the safe side.

Our monthly Walkthru is very likely on Sunday 5th at 10:00 am. Bundle up and join us for this deep winter shoot.

Our monthly meeting will be on Wednesday 9th at 7:30 pm. Come on out and we'll probably be talking about the upcoming Kalamazoo show in March, and probably also start talking about upcoming spring projects that we might want to do. Any suggestions you might have would be considered and discussed. I believe this year we'd like to build the outdoor oven for the grill area so that's one project.

The annual Hog Shoot in Tecumseh is also probably this month as usual, possibly the weekend of Feb. 11-12. Join us on this trek for a fun mid-winter shoot. Call Greg or come to the meeting for details.

Did you know?..... in Native American tribes who lived in heavily forested areas February is the month when the women and children of the village headed out into the woods to their own private "Sugar Bush" area and made a small camp. Time was spent tapping the maple trees, hanging skin "buckets" to capture the water (sap) and gathering wood for the daily fires. Once the sap starts to run (when it's below freezing at night, and daytime temps are 40 or above) they spent time gathering the liquid which is now dripping from the taps, boiling it off over the fires, and making syrup and sugar. Enough syrup and sugar was made to last an entire year, and they used them for a variety of foods they made. They even made maple candy. This is done by boiling off the liquid enough so that it starts turning into syrup or just beyond that, then throwing spoonfuls of it into the snow. On contact with the cold air and snow the big drops harden into maple candy. Sugar is made from boiling the liquid past the syrup stage until it crystallizes. Sugar and syrup was used for much of their cooking, and it was also a big trade item. I have made maple syrup myself and now I will not even buy the "fake:" stuff anymore. Real maple syrup is the only way to go for pancakes and French Toast.

Next month is the big re-enactors show of the year, The Kalamazoo Antique Firearms Show, probably the third weekend of March, or maybe even the second weekend. Kathy (Thimblewoman) will be making our hotel reservations so please call her ASAP if you want a room. They go quickly so don't dilly dally. Her number is on page 2 of this Window, right under Greg's name. Come to the meeting and we'll be talking about it anyhow.

Well it looks like that roast is done now..... see the juices dripping into the fire? Man that sure does smell good doesn't it? The women have given us some new potatoes, preserved vegetables, onions, and dried spices to boil up for a side dish. I'll sign off now and we'll partake in these fine victuals. Aren't too many things what beat a fresh elk roast slow cooked over a fire. Hey, looks like the women and kids have made us some dessert too..... some kind of sweet cake they make using flour, wild rice they also gather and process themselves, spices they have picked and dried, and sugar from those maple trees..... let's eat!!!!

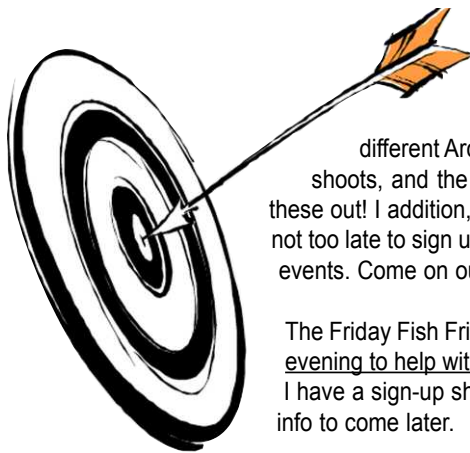
