Shooting Times

Registration: 9:00 am to 1:30 pm

Shooting: 9:30 am until the last registrant completes course of fire (about 2:30 pm)

Introduction

The Falling Plate Event consists of attempting to knock over a string of six steel plates with six shots. Each participant will shoot two six shot strings for each stage. There are four stages, at the 10-, 15-, 20- and 25-yard shooting lines. It takes 48 shots to complete the full course of fire, more if there are equipment malfunctions. Participants may shoot as many courses of fire as desired during the event, with the best score used for the event summary.

Targets

.22LR rimfire handguns & PCC; 6" diameter steel plates Centerfire handguns & PCC; 8" diameter steel plates

Distance: 10, 15, 20 & 25 yards, see below for more details

Equipment

Firearm: Any .22 LR or center fire handgun (revolver or semi-auto) or pistol cartridge carbine (PCC). There is a six-cartridge maximum load limit per string. All sight types are acceptable (ie. iron, red dot, laser, etc.). Canter-fire cartridge limits: .38 Spl / 9mm or larger, no +P or magnums or no calibers LARGER than .45 ACP. Other: Signed liability waivers, safety glasses and hearing protection are required for all shooters, timers and spectators.

Procedure

At the command of the range officer, the shooters will load their firearm with 6 cartridges. When all guns are loaded and are at the ready position (muzzle down, 45-degree angle), the range officer will blow a whistle. This will start the timers and the shooters will commence shooting. The timer will stop after hearing the sixth shot. At this time, firearms are reloaded, hit count & actual time is recorded, and the plate stands are reset. Once everyone is ready to shoot again, the process is repeated for a second time. Shooters will repeat this two-string process for each of the four stages. Each stage will be shot at one of four distances, starting at the 10-yard shooting line, and then moving to the 15, 20 and finishing at the 25-yard line. Everyone is allowed one alibi (reshoot) for equipment malfunctions.

Once each shooter has completed their course of fire, they will be asked to perform the timing & plate resetting role for the next line of shoots.

Scoring

All 8 strings of hits & time scores will be tallied. A combination of plates knocked over (hits) and total time are mathematically combined towards everyone's final score. There are *no default times used in Falling Plates*, only actual time and hits are used to compute the final score.

Scoring Divisions: .22LR iron sight, .22LR optics, CF iron sight, and CF optic sight for both handgun & PCC.

Results / Pavback
