Shooting times:

Registration: 8:30 am to 1:30 pm

Shooting: 9:00 am until the last registrant completes course of fire (about 2:30 pm)

Introduction

The Steel Challenge Event consists of shooting a string of five steel plates per stage. There are four different station setups, and each station is shot three times. Each participant will shoot as many rounds as it takes to hit all five plates. It will take at least 60 rounds to complete each course of fire, or more depending on the skill level of the participant. The total time to hit all five plates for each string and stage will be recorded. Participants may shoot as many courses of fire as desired during the event, with the best score total will be used for the event summary.

Targets

Various sizes and shapes of steel plates: 10-in and 12-in circular, rectangular and poker card shapes, and large 18-in x 24-in rectangles

Distance: 10 to 20 yards

Equipment

Firearms: Any .22 LR or any center fire handgun (revolver or semi-auto) or pistol cartridge carbine (PCC) may be used. There is a ten-cartridge maximum load limit per string. All sight types are acceptable (i.e. iron, red dot, laser, etc.).

Center-fire cartridge limits: .38 Spl / 9mm or larger, no +P or magnums, no calibers LARGER than .45 ACP Other: Signed liability waivers, safety glasses and hearing protection are required for all shooters, timers and spectators.

Procedure

At the command of the range officer, the shooters will load their firearms. When all the guns are loaded and in the ready position (muzzle down, 45-degree angle), the range officer will blow a whistle. This will start the timers and the shooters will commence shooting. The timer will stop after hearing a hit on the last plate. Reloading the gun is permissible as necessary to hit all five plates. The *actual* time to hit all 5 targets is recorded for each string and stage. Participants will shoot three strings for each of the four stages. Everyone is allowed one alibi (reshoot) for equipment malfunctions.

Scoring

The total time for each string, from the start of the shot timer to hitting the last plate, will be recorded on the participants score sheet. There will be 12 times recorded in total to complete the course of fire (3 strings of fire at each of 4 stations). The course of fire total will be the simple addition of the 12 times recorded on the score sheet. There will be a *default time* of 15 seconds recorded if the shooter is unable to complete the string (i.e. equipment malfunction or other reason).

Scoring Divisions: .22LR iron sight, .22LR optics, CF iron sight, and CF optic sight for both handgun & PCC.

Results / Payback
